1700 Tsunami

A powerful magnitude 9 earthquake struck off the coast of B.C. on January 26, 1700 at about 9 p.m. Without warning, the quake was followed by a catastrophic tsunami that devastated local villages. With no time to respond, thousands of residents were lost.

For generations, Elders have carried this oral history. Today, our people call Anacla (Pachena Bay) home and this oral history plays a central role in how we understand tsunami risks and prepare for future tsunamis.

3 types of earthquakes
● Crustal earthquakes
